With the support of a K99/R00 Pathway to Independence Award and Loan Repayment Program Renewal Award from the Eunice Kennedy Shriver National Institute of Child Health and Human Development (NICHD), as part of the R00 phase, I am recruiting a sample of 13- to 17-year-olds to: (1) investigate how the friendships of maltreated adolescents differ from those of non-maltreated adolescents using longitudinal and observational methods and (2) determine which friendship experiences influence the associations between maltreatment and psychophysiological regulation to a laboratory stressor, as well as later psychopathology/revictimization.
